**Opening Song** ~ If You're Happy (Primary Hymnbook; Hymn 266) \*Sing a song ☺

**Opening Prayer**

**Scripture** ~ Open Scriptures to D&C 25:12, and read. To reinforce the idea that goes with the lesson you can say, "It makes Heavenly Father happy when we sing church songs!"

**Scripture Story** ~ Emma Smith

Emma Smith was the wife of Joseph Smith.

She asked how she could help the church.

Heavenly Father asked her to help make a hymn book.

We still sing some of the songs in church today, they did back then!

**Activity** ~ Sing!

There are many songs you can sing! As this is FHE let's try to keep it to church songs as best we can. Here are some starters if you get stuck: Once There Was a Snowman, Book of Mormon Stories, Give Said the Little Stream, Popcorn Popping, or I am a Child of God. Most children love music, so sing with them until they are ready to be done. If you are up for it see the extra activities that has to do with making instruments to play along with your singing!

## Extra Activities for This Lesson ~

### 1 ~ Make your own Instrument

Use pots and pans for drums, fill an empty water bottle or Easter egg with rice, make a tissue box/ rubber band guitar and play along with your singing! Or if you already have instruments and you are ok with your child playing them, let them enjoy music!

### 2 ~ Repeat the beat

Use a different combination of claps each time, and have your child repeat you. After they get it down, see if they want to make up a beat for you to copy. Take turns who goes first!
